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the first volume of hiphoped the compilation on hip hop education brings together veteran and emerging scholars practitioners and students from a variety of fields to share their research and experiences as it relates to the use of hip hop in educational spaces this text extends the current literature on hip hop and education and focuses

on the philosophy of hip hop and education the impact that hip hop culture has on the identity of educators and the use of hip hop to inform mental health practices through their personal and practical experiences authors of this text will spark new and creative uses of hip hop culture in educational spaces

see you at the crossroads hip hop scholarship at the intersections dialectical harmony ethics aesthetics and panoply of voices offers several essential contributions to the field of hip hop studies it presents several snapshots of innovative work within and at the intersections between several intellectual fields of study the collection of essays reveal the dialectical harmony and solidarity with which hip hop scholars activists and artists collectively mobilize stand together and collaboratively sustain in hopes of realizing social justice and actualizing global liberation several leading scholars in hip hop studies also provide insight to the aesthetic the affordances the ethics and panoply of voices in hip hop culture finally through empirical research direct artistic engagement and critical pedagogical praxis the contributors demonstrate how hip hop based education hhbe catalyzes civic engagement and democratic participation in schools through the use of democratic aesthetic tools to galvanize social change

winner of the 2022 2023 new york city book awards special mention 2023 iaspm book prize given by the international association for the study of popular music shortlisted 2023 ralph j gleason book award given by the rock n roll hall of fame clive davis institute unearths the queer aesthetic origins of nyc hip hop hip hop heresies centers new york city as a space where vibrant queer black and hip hop worlds collide and bond in dance clubs schools roller rinks basketball courts subways and movie houses using this cultural nexus as the stage shanté paradigm smalls attends to the ways that hip hop cultural production in new york city from the 1970s through the early twenty first century produced film visual art and music that offer queer articulations of race gender and sexuality to illustrate new york city as a place of experimental aesthetic collaboration smalls brings four cultural moments to the forefront the life and work of the gay chinese american visual and graffiti artist martin wong who brokered the relationship between new york city graffiti artists and gallery and museum spaces the brooklyn based rapper singer writer producer jean grae one of the most prolific and underrated emcees of the last two decades the iconic 1980s film the last dragon which exemplifies the experimental and queer black masculinity possible in early formal hip hop culture and finally queer and trans identified hip hop artists and groups like bq deepdickcollective and hanifah walidah and the documentary pick up the mic hip hop heresies transforms the landscape of hip hop scholarship black studies and queer studies by bringing together these fields through the hermeneutic of aesthetics providing a guidepost for future scholarship on queer trans and feminist hip hop studies hip hop heresies takes seriously the work

that new york city hip hop cultural production has done and will do and advocates a form of hip hop that eschews authenticity in favor of performativity bricolage and pastiche

the power and freedom of black feminist and womanist pedagogy still woke celebrates and reaffirms the power of black feminist and womanist pedagogies and practices in university classrooms employing autocritography through personal reflection research and critical analysis the contributors to the volume boldly tell groundbreaking stories of their teaching experiences and their evolving relationships to black feminist and womanist theory and criticism from their own unique perspectives each contributor views teaching as a life changing collaborative and interactive endeavor with students moreover each of them envisions their pedagogical practice as a strategic vehicle to transport the legacy of struggles for liberating social justice and transformative change in the u s and globally firmly grounded in black feminist and womanist theory and practice this book honors the herstorical labor of black women and women of color intellectual activists who have unapologetically held up the banner of freedom in academia

this book has received the aesa american educational studies association critics choice award 2013 through ethnographically informed interviews and observations conducted with six black middle and high school girls hip hop s li l sistas speak explores how young women navigate the space of hip hop music and culture to form ideas concerning race body class inequality and privilege the thriving atmosphere of atlanta georgia serves as the background against which these youth consume hip hop and the book examines how the city s socially conservative politics urban gentrification race relations southern flavored hip hop music and culture and booming adult entertainment industry rest in their periphery intertwined within the girls exploration of hip hop and coming of age in atlanta the author shares her love for the culture struggles of being a queer educator and a black lesbian living and researching in the south and reimagining hip hop pedagogy for urban learners

as hip hop artists constantly struggle to keep it real this fascinating study examines the debates over the core codes of hip hop authenticity as it reflects and reacts to problematic black images in popular culture placing hip hop in its proper cultural political and social contexts

transatlantic negotiations was the theme of the 52 annual convention of the german association for american studies held in frankfurt in 2005 each contribution to this volume illuminates explicitly or implicitly the intricacies of negotiations embedded in different relationships of power as they reverberate through history together they

present a wide range of forms of interaction between europe africa and america from fruitful exchange to contemptuous or thoughtless discrimination the collection thus points to a salient feature of transatlantic relations namely the simultaneity of mutual enriching forms of negotiation marked by reciprocity with drastic forms of inequality in which the negotiating power is almost entirely one sided

this issue considers the emotional complexities of intergroup conflict the chapter authors examine the relational challenges that youth encounter in dealing with conflict and combining innovative theory with ambitious practical application identify conflict management strategies these interventions have affected millions of youth across the continents

this book explores eight artist led participatory projects in different sites across england it deals with a practice where artists engage with people usually non artists through a process of collaboration and dialogue as a way of creating events encounters activism as well as art objects intro

this text offers a conceptual communication approach to defining the cultural self it focuses upon the concept of whiteness and its equation with being american and enlarges this to encompass how european americans and african americans can be racially marginalized

based on a diverse range of texts and sites including bridget jones african american music videos news coverage radio shows the scream trilogy sex and the city and hip hop the authors analyse how different meanings of feminism have been negotiated within popular culture and how popular culture has made sense of feminism

focusing on expressions of popular culture among blacks in africa the united states and the caribbean this collection of 15 multidisciplinary essays takes on a range of subjects from american girls double dutch games to protest discourse in ghana from terry mcmillan s waiting to exhale to the work of zora neale hurston from south african workers to just another girl on the irt from the history of rasta to the evolving significance of kente cloth from rap video music to hip hop to zouk
